Be A Heart with Ears

Recently our Caregivers Group (open to any and all), hosted a speaker, Charmissa Biscoe, a Certified Grief Recovery Specialist. Charmissa did a wonderful job

of discussing how we should help someone through grief recovery. Someone asked, "How should we respond to someone in grief?" Charmissa's response was, "Be a heart with ears."

I'm making that quote my own! "Be a heart with ears."

Many of us in practicing our faith believe that we should have all the answers. After all, our God is a God of wisdom and knowledge, right? I feel pressure to have answers to complex questions ... scripture should answer every problem in life!

Well yes, scripture does apply to every situation in life. Yet, sometimes, we must let God reveal Himself to others through time, circumstances, events, even other people.

Since we don't always understand the big picture, it becomes paramount that we listen more than we speak and that our heart would be ready and help us recognize what we should do to help others. Being a heart with ears would move us to listen, be ready, be willing, and most of all, love others where they are AND not where we think they should be.

James 1:19 "My dear bothers and sisters, take note of this: Everyone should be quick to listen, slow to speak..."

My Story

Greetings,

For those who do not know me very well I would like to share some of my story of why I do what I do today - Preach the Gospel.

My family and I attended a local church (Galilee Christian Church). I served as a deacon and youth leader there. Life was good. At that time, I was a Supervisor at VDO. Then our oldest son (Eric 18 at the time) was in a car accident.

When we arrived at the hospital in Morgantown WV, he was listed as John Doe. Tragically, his friend was killed in the accident. Eric was on life support, and we were told he would be there for an extended time and would need much rehabilitation. Rhonda started prayer chains everywhere. I laid over my son and prayed all night.

I had been struggling with going to Bible College and didn't see a way with my family and responsibilities. I promised God to do what He wanted if he spared my son's life. Prayers were answered we took him home using a walker in three days. This was in June; in August I was enrolled in Bible College (Bluefield College of Evangelism). We sold everything and took the family to Bluefield WV. We were away from Winchester for five years. I ministered at a church while I finished college.

We then returned home to Winchester and started a new church work in 2005 (Living Waters) and now I am here to serve at Round Hill Church. I'm still fulfilling my promise to God and planning to do this until He calls me home. Please don't hesitate to contact me if I can help you in any way!


Save The Date—Obeying God's Call

Meaning & Symbolism of Chrismons

Each year, we decorate our sanctuary tree with beautiful reminders of our faith called Chrismons. The use of Chrismons originated at Ascension Lutheran Church in Danville, Virginia in 1957. The word Chrismon is derived from "Christ Monogram." Chrismons are traditionally white and gold. White being the liturgical color of Christmas and Easter and gold representing the glory, majesty, and kingship of Jesus. While the meanings and symbolism of some of the symbols are obvious, others are more nuanced. Below is an explanation of some of the symbols you will find on our tree this year.

Triumphant Cross	Cross sits on a circle which represents the Earth Jesus is triumphant over anything we can face in this world.
Irish or Celtic Cross	The circle in the middle symbolizes eternity
Ichthus Fish	One of the oldest Christian symbols Acrostic for the Greek words meaning Jesus Christ, God's Son, and Savior
Chi-Rho	First 2 letters of the Greek word Christos which means Christ
Five Pointed Star	Represents the five wounds of Jesus on the cross
Natal Star	Four large points representing the Star of Bethlehem and four smaller points representing the four gospels
Lamp or Candle	Jesus is the light of the world
Shell	Symbol of baptism
Keys	Jesus told Peter "I will give you the keys to heaven"
Butterfly	Symbol for transformation and an immortal soul
Anchor	Cross of Hope reminding us that Jesus is the anchor of our faith



The renovations and handicapped improvements to the fellowship bathrooms are almost complete. The bathroom doors meet the present width for handicapped access, along with more space in bathroom once the dividers were removed. The facilities committee appreciates everyone's patience while we completed the project.

The painting projects around the church interior have started, the following areas need painting, office hallway walls, administrative office, secretary's office, fix a speaker hole in wall of nursey, fix screw holes in walls of hallway next to sanctuary, and fellowship entrance hallway where bathrooms are. We will have signs warning of wet paint, please use caution in these areas.

Storage racks for the pavilion are in and should be installed soon. This will allow us to organize the pavilion and be able to store more church items in an organized manner.

Giffin Funeral Home Monument Crew, will be adjusting the leaning and knocked over tombstones in the cemetery next to the church. The crew will also clean and fix the tombstones as need, respecting those who are at their final resting place.

Facilities committee at the recommendation of BK Security Solutions has approved an upgrade to the present security equipment, resolving an issue we had in the past when we lost internet.

Every Sunday, we continue to see new faces visiting the Round Hill Church, what a blessing to have. The Church Board and Facilities committee are continuing monitor church attendance and activities as we grow, to make necessary changes for our church family needs. We ask our church family to please consider sitting in the front pews of the Sanctuary, allowing new people coming to church, who prefer sitting in the back of the church, until they get to know everyone.

The safety team will continue to make improvements to the team and schedule more safety training in the upcoming months. If you are an EMT or nurse, we need your help in adding medical care to the safety team for our church family. If you have any interest in being a part of the safety team please see Rocky Keplinger.

cancer center. They are always in need of calendars to keep track of all their medical appointments. One person's trash is another person's treasure. Spread the love!




